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Cent Challenge

On Monday 23rd and Tuesday 24th February, the Student Council are hosting a Cent Challenge. In a Cent Challenge, groups compete to win a fundraising competition. Each group has a bucket for collecting coins or dollar bills. This will be a house competition on Teraja (P4-P8). Each house can earn points or have points taken off them depending on the type of coin/note.

In line with the National Curriculum of England, changes have been made to this year's student reports for P2 to P8. In addition, we are using new technology in Pre Nursery and Nursery with a program called Tapestry. Tapestry enables greater links between home and school and will result in modifications to reporting from this academic year for Pre Nursery and Nursery. P1 student reports will remain unchanged this academic year.

This Parent Information Session is designed to inform parents of changes to student reporting, as well as provide information about ISAs. ISAs assessment takes place in October each year for students in P5 to P8. This assessment, "International Schools Assessment" is the assessment of choice for Shell Schools globally, providing a comparable of student and school performance from numerous international schools, providing teaching and learning in English instruction.
